► Healthcare suffering from 'lack of resources, poor service delivery' www.bereamail.co.za Health workers demand an end to failing services

HUNDREDS of doctors, nurses and health care workers, took to the streets of Durban on Friday in an effort to raise awareness on what they see is poor service delivery and insufficient resources in government hospitals.

The protestors marched from Botha's Park to Durban City Hall and handed over a memorandum which includes, among other things, the shortage of specialist doctors, shortage of posts for intern doctors, lack of medicine, insufficient medical equipment and poor infrastructure.

Dr Mvuyisi Mzukwa, South African Medical Association (SAMA) KZN Coastal Branch chairperson said the protest march was aimed at creating



public awareness of the poor state of public healthcare in the province.

"Through this awareness we hope to gain support from the public as we demand an end to the rapidly deteriorating delivery of healthcare services in our province. This situation is getting worse every day.

As healthcare professionals we are duty bound to do something about it. This situation cannot continue without meaningful intervention. The branch is alarmed by the Provincial Health Department's decision to unilaterally change the conditions of employment of all doctors by freezing critical posts, creating unfunded posts, keeping some doctors unemployed, and introducing a new commuted overtime policy without adequate consultation," Mzukwa said.

Subsequent to the introduction of the new policy, the union held a number of meetings with health officials demanding changes. A consultative process began with the National Department of Health, but the Provincial Health Department betrayed the process by commencing threatening workshops to enforce the unilateral implementation of the new policy. "We have noticed a sharp deterioration in healthcare at hospitals and clinics in the province over the years. Indications of this include shortages of medicines, collapsing infrastructure, broken equipment and inadequate provision of staff. This has led to a situation where access to healthcare services and patient dignity is compromised daily," said Mzukwa.

The Health and Other Service Personnel Trade Union of South Africa (Hospersa) General Secretary Noel Desfontaines said: "We support the doctors' plea for the filling of critical posts which is affecting service delivery and contributing to the high medicolegal claims. Doctors are also human and need to be supported with adequate human capacity so they do not burn-out from working long hours with limited resources," said Desfontaines.

The staff shortage in KZN has hit cancer patients the worst. It is reported that there is only one oncologist in the whole of Durban and in the South Coast area. There is also only one urologist in the whole region, with only a single part-time specialist supervising the complicated treatment of more than 400 diabetic children. Hospital security was also raised as an issue as guards at the hospitals are not properly trained to deal with patients in a hospital environment.

Illegal occupants take over derelict hospital buildings

THE illegal occupation of derelict buildings within the King Dinizulu Hospital Complex (KDHC) in Durban and subsequent complaints from neighbouring residents, has forced the DA to appeal to KZN Health MEC, Sibongiseni Dhlomo, to act immediately by enforcing stricter security measures within the hospital complex.

The matter was raised in the provincial legislature last week by the opposition party when it tabled a motion calling for strengthened security after an increased presence of the illegal occupation of buildings at the hospital complex allegedly by drug dealers and sex workers who have moved into the abandoned and derelict former nurses' hostel on the property.

Residents in the vicinity who have been plagued by an increase in noise, litter and higher than usual level of criminal activity, together with ward councillor Chris Pappas, approached the hospital management to raise their concerns, but the problem persists.

Pappas said the DA had received volumes of correspondence and a petition regarding the matter. "This includes 129 signatures of residents in the area which we forwarded to the DoH, but no official acknowledgement of receipt has been received," he said, adding the MEC would be held accountable.

Dr Imran Keeka MPL, DA KZN Spokesperson on Health, said the DA had also been led to believe that security guards posted at the building were allowing free passage to anyone, rather than preventing trespassers from accessing the facility.

"This necessitates, as an immediate step, an increase and improvement in security services at the derelict building. It is clear that the MEC has been sitting on his hands and has not acted upon the grievances received from the community. This problem has been in existence since at least February, with residents claiming that the problems began as far back as late 2016," said Keeka.

Keeka said, as the custodian of healthcare in KZN, the DA expected the MEC to take full responsibility for the situation and enforce stricter security measures, to ensure that the hospital complex was restored to its former state.

"We expect the MEC to work with the infrastructure department, the Department of Justice and SAPS to immediately solve the root of this ongoing problem of illegal occupation of unused buildings," said Keeka.

Children taught good hand hygiene

STAFF from the new Ahmed Al-Kadi Private Hospital took the message of healthy hand hygiene to three schools in the area last week, in commemoration of World Hand Hygiene Day on 5 May.

According to Sr Saloshni Beetham, in a major global effort to improve hand hygiene in health care led by the World Health Organisation (WHO), the annual global campaign was launched in 2009 to support health-care workers.

The WHO sets the standards for hand hygiene and encourages health professions to engage in interactive activities with their communities on the day throughout the world.

The WHO is running a competition where health organisations can submit a video or posters relating to the projects they completed on World Hand Hygiene Day. Staff at the Ahmed Al-Kadi Hospital submitted a video from their visits to the various schools in Sydenham.

The staff put together a dance with an African theme which focused on the eight steps of hand hygiene. The video, along with posters from each department at the hospital, will be submitted to the competition.

"Our song brings it down to the level of the community and we hope the children at the schools we visited were inspired to take what they learnt home to teach their families about proper hand hygiene," said Saloshni.

She said the KZN Medical Specialist Network was also running a competition, and the hospital would also be entering their video into this.

Clean hands vital for infection control

ACCORDING to the World Health Organisation (WHO), adequate hand hygiene can reduce the risk for healthcare associated infections (HAIs) and has the potential to save 8 million lives each year in hospitals alone.

However, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) reports that, on average, health care providers perform hand hygiene practices less than half of the time that they should.

To raise awareness among healthcare professionals about the critical importance of hand hygiene in improving patient outcomes, McCord Provincial Eye Hospital hosted a hand hygiene awareness campaign, to celebrate World Hand Hygiene Day last Friday.

The Public Relations Officer of the hospital, Zodwa Mbatha, said the campaign highlighted *Five Moments for Hand Hygiene* which aims to ensure that every healthcare worker washes their hands before and after touching a patient, before clean or antiseptic procedures, after touching a patients' surroundings and after any body fluid exposure.

Need to know

• For hand washing to be effective, you can't use water alone but must use soap.

• Wash hands before eating, feeding babies, playing with or feeding pets, preparing food and after visits to the bathroom

"Today's campaign programme included dissemination of guidance materials and a workshop on hand hygiene. Visiting various departments for judging displays and hand washing techniques. Health care workers and the general public need to be made aware about the importance of hand hygiene," she said. WHO estimates that one out of every 10 patients contracts an infection while receiving medical care. Moreover, up to 32% of patients undergoing surgery develop a postoperative infection, 51% of which are resistant to antibiotics. To prevent further spread of antibiotic resistance, the health body is urging policymakers to make infection prevention and hand hygiene a national policy priority. The organization is also calling on health care facilities and leaders in infection control to implement WHO's core components for infection prevention. "Effective hand washing could help prevent the spread of colds and flu," she said, and encouraged the community to speak up for their health and advised them not to be afraid to ask nurses to wash their hands before touching them.

► Iconic sports stadium falling into dishevelled state

Lack of maintenance could cost millions

DURBAN'S landmark Moses Mabhida Stadium has forever changed the skyline and become a proud monument and reminder of the success of the 2010 soccer world cup and offers a hub of activities for visitors and locals alike.

Now however, there is concern that a lack of maintenance may well jeopardise the stadium's iconic status.


A close up look at the stadium shows evidence of neglect and wear and tear, and unless the City moves urgently to repair the damage, it is going to face a repair costing tens of millions of Rands if left unattended.

Local ward councillor Martin Meyer this week raised his concerns over the lack of maintenance.

"The condition of the stadium is concerning. Panels have fallen off the structure, the paint is peeling off the arch, the sky car is out of order and parts have to be ordered, so there is a hold-up and recently, soccer players complained about the quality of the pitch. We can't allow this very expensive city asset to go down the drain," he said.

Meyer said in 2015 there was talk of putting the stadium under the management of the International Convention Centre, which he said he supported. However, the process was delayed by the Community and Emergency Services Committee until after the elections.

'At a Council meeting in February this year, it was brought forward to allow the city manager to negotiate for the stadium to come under the City's management along with other stadiums

in eThekwini, however no decision has been made," he said.

According to Meyer, the management of the stadium has been in limbo

for two years and the result of this is evident.


"As a direct result, there has been no maintenance of the stadium, there is no clear plan and we don't even know what budget is available for the upkeep of the stadium, so nothing is happening."

He said the stadium is beautiful and well-situated and should be a major tourist attraction.

"There was talk of this stadium being the best in the country as it could be used not only as a soccer stadium, but as a shopping centre, however, a lot of the commercial space is empty.

"It is disappointing that the sky car was not operational at a time when international delegates were in town for the World Economic Forum," said Meyer.

> He said the stadium was already costing the City millions of Rands a month to run, and he felt if small maintenance jobs were not done when required, the City would end up spending tens of millions of Rands to fix it, money the City does not have.

> "The stadium has become an icon of Durban, but like the City, it is looking shabby and falling apart," he said.

"The purpose of the march is for people, organisations, communities, movements and campaigns to demonstrate their dissatisfaction with corruption and looting in South Africa, in the rest of Africa and across the world, by self-interested and self-serving political and business elites," said Alice Thompson from the Forum.

The march was also an opportunity for people to show their support for a government and economy that serves the needs and interests of people rather than a privileged few. "Lastly, the purpose of the march is so that we, the African people who are not invited to attend WEF on Africa and influence the policies that affect our everyday lives, to show our power and have our own meeting on the streets of Africa," said D'Sa.

Cycling community rallies to assist hit-and-run victim

THE life of Durban cyclist, Siyabonga Njiva, was turned upside down on Sunday, 7 May, when he was injured in a hit-and-run incident as he was crossing Anton Lembede (Smith) Street at about 9pm.

The driver of the vehicle stopped and got out, looked at where Siya was lying and fled the scene on foot. The vehicle has been impounded by police. Siya was taken to Addington Hospital with serious injuries including four breaks in his right leg and a break on his right elbow. He will have to undergo surgery for pins to be inserted in his broken leg. Now an appeal is being made to the Durban cycling community to support Siya by donating into a trust account that will be used for his rehabilitation costs.

According to Shaun Peschl from Peschlsports, Siya is one of the country's top semi-professional cyclists who also plays a huge role in developing younger athletes in the city's Go Durban Cycle Academy. "Our concern is that if the operation is not done in the next few days, this could ultimately affect Siya long term in his profession which will be agreat loss for us in the cycling industry, especially for the younger kids who look up to him as a role model," said Shaun. The Siya Njiva Trust Account is in the process of being set up for the riding community to do



Recent crime statistics show a steady rise

CARJACKING, robbery at home and robbery at non-residential premises statistics all saw large increases, with incidents of vehicle hijacking seeing the biggest increase across all crime categories.

This was revealed in a recent crime statistic report, released by the SAPS for the period April 2016 – December 2016. Since the start of this year, a number of jewellery shops, one second-hand store and cellphone stores in some of the city's busiest centres have fallen victim to crime. Most recently, a gang of five hammer-wielding gunmen stormed The Workshop – in the CBD – early on Saturday morning and broke into a clothing store. Blue Security operations manager Brian Jackson said two of them were wearing balaclavas. "The armed robbers walked into the mall and pointed their firearms at security guards on site before using a hammer to smash their way into a clothing store. They smashed the front door down and grabbed clothing and cash before fleeing the scene," Jackson said.

Last month, a gang reportedly used a similar modus operandi to break into a shop in the Southway Mall in Seaview and stole tens of thousands of rands worth of goods. Numerous jewellery shops at the Pearls Mall in Umhlanga, Cash Crusaders, in the Atrium, Watches Unlimited and MTN – both at Musgrave Centre – as well as NWJ at Westwood Mall were also reportedly robbed last month.

In March, Mayuri Jewellers in Chatsworth Centre was hit and in January, three stores – including Natal Wholesale Jewellers (NWJ) in Musgrave Centre, Osiniq Jewels at the Hilton Hotel and Cajee at Gateway – were targeted. In the wake of a string of brazen armed robberies, the Durban Chamber of Commerce and Industry is expected to convene a multi-stakeholder meeting to address the issue of crime in the city's commercial hubs.

Chief executive of the chamber Dumile Cele says that the prevalence of this type of crime was of serious concern to the business community. "It has highly negative effects on doing business in those areas," Cele said, "Crime infested areas are a deterrent to consumers who naturally avoid shopping in areas where they do not feel safe," Cele said.

Driver killed in Durban crash

THE driver of a vehicle was killed and three others injured after the vehicle they were in left the N3 near Old Dutch Road on Sunday afternoon and collided with a concrete wall in central Durban. Rescue Care Operations Director, Garrith Jamieson said Just after 11:30am on Sunday morning paramedics responded to the collision on the N3.

"On their assessment it was found that the driver, a male believed to be in his thirties, had sustained major injuries and had passed away before paramedics' arrival. He was declared deceased on the scene. Three passengers were stabilised at the scene before being transported to a nearby hospital," Jamieson said.

Jamieson said at the time of reporting, the exact cause of the collision was unknown.

Municipality warns of banking hoax

THE public is urged to be aware of a fraudulent two-page letter being circulated notifying customers of alleged changes to the city's banking details.

According to eThekwini Municipality's Head of Communications, Tozi Mthethwa, the first page bears the incorrect municipal logo with an unknown address while the second page is a letter allegedly signed by ABSA bank.

The two page letter instructs cus-

tomers to make all payments for their municipal accounts into a new ABSA account, effective from 1 April 2017. It further states that the previous municipal account is reserved only for Forex and international clients, which is incorrect.

Mthethwa said as of 1 October 2015, eThekwini Municipality had moved all its accounts from Standard Bank to Nedbank and all municipal bills issued to customers have the correct banking details at the bottom of the page.

"The Municipality is currently investigating the source of this fraudulent letter. We appeal to customers who may have received this letter to take it to their closest Sizakala Customer Care centre or to report it to the municipality's City Integrity and Investigations Unit," she said.

Bulwer ambassador praised for a job well done

NKANYISO Aubrey Magwaza, one of the Bulwer Community Improvement Project's (BCIP) community ambassadors, has been praised for his hard work and for being elected Ambassador of the Month.

Aubrey was commended for calling for the police during a recent armed robbery in the Bulwer area during which he had been locked in a liquor fridge.

"It was on a Sunday at around 1.15pm and I was loading a customer's car when someone tapped me on the shoulder and called me inside. I said I was busy, but he pulled out a gun and took me inside. People were lying on the floor and I saw guys taking money out of the tills. I was put in a liquor fridge along with staff and customers. I managed to call Heather on my radio to say there was an armed robbery," he said.

Aubrey and the others were let out of the fridge by a customer who had gone into the shop after the armed robbers fled.

He was also praised for assisting in the arrest of a mugger in the area last Wednesday.

"A schoolboy was walking and talking on his cellphone when this guy came up, grabbed his cellphone and ran. A business owner saw it happen and followed the thief and asked me to hold him after he was caught as he had to go off to a meet-

ing. I called for assistance and held him until the police arrived to arrest him," he said.

Heather said this showed that the ambassadors were doing much more than keeping cars in the area safe and cleaning the pavements in Helen Joseph Road.

"They're the eyes and ears on the road and are definitely making a difference. I hope more businesses come on board so we can get more ambassadors on the road with more radios," she said.

EDITOR - On the 29 June 2015, the Honourable Madam Justice Stevn handed down a judgment in case 12052/2014 in the High Court of South Africa - KZN Local Division where she found for the applicant, Tayob Nazeer Aboobaker and 5 others and against the 1st and 2nd respondents being Serengeti Rise Body Corporate and the eThekwini Municipality.

The judgment arose from the application heard on 14 May 2015 in which the development at 317 Currie Road, Durban was found to be illegal. In her judgment, Justice Steyn ruled, "In light of this finding this Court considers the following relief as just and equitable and is ordered that;

1. The development on the property situate at 317 Currie Road that exceeds GR1 zoning be demolished

2. The respondents to pay the costs of this application, jointly and severally, such costs to include the costs of two counsel where so employed.

As was expected, the first respondent appealed this judgment but what was not expected was that the eThekwini Municipality would join this appeal despite all that came out in the trial. The municipality is there to serve the people of Durban and by no stretch of the imagination can this action be seen to be doing that.

The municipality and the council, allowed their planning committee, chaired at the time by a councillor, who has since be gaoled for murder and who admitted involvement in corrupt activities to rezone this property and allow this monstrosity to be built when it would clearly, nega-

tively affect the values of neighbouring properties. Nobody from the City has ever answered the question of why they took that action in favour of one developer over the interests of the people of Durban.

This week 10 May, in Bloemfontein, five appeal court judges will review this judgment. The legal teams are gathered. Advocate Kemp J Kemp SC will lead the charge in asking the appeal court to uphold this judgment that has far reaching consequences for every citizen in this City. The alternative is too horrendous to visualize because it will open the door for greedy developers, with the assistance of uncaring politicians, to ride roughshod over the ratepayers of Durban." **Kevin Dunkley**

School supports handbag project for rape survivors

GLENWOOD High School is throwing its support behind the Jes Foord Handbag Project once again this year as part of its Old Boys' Weekend celebrations at the end of May.

The handbags will be handed over to the Jes Foord Foundation on Friday 26 May 2017 during assembly. Last year the Glenwood family pulled together and collected more than 100 bags for rape survivors.

The school has appealed to the community to assist with the project by donating new or used handbags containing items that can assist a rape victim during the initial reporting process at the police station. These items include a facecloth, soap, deodorant spray and new underwear. The project not only delivers handbags for women, but backpacks for men and children, as women are not the only rape victims. Each handbag received will be packed with the items.

"Obviously it would be greatly appreciated if people could hand in a bag with a few items, but an empty handbag is of great help as well. Should you wish to donate a bulk of certain items and not individual bags, you are most welcome to do so," said Hannelie Erasmus from Glenwood High.

For children, the school packs a Kiddi-pack, which is in high demand. Items needed for these packs are an A4 sized fabric drawstring bag, or small back pack, panties/underpants, a pack of tissues or wet wipes, soap and facecloth, sanitary pad, a notebook, blue ball point pen, colouring pencils/crayons, and a teddy or small soft toy for comfort.

For the rape comfort bags, the items needed include a face cloth, panties (small, medium or large), sanitary towels, soap (liquid or bar), some body lotion (small), toothpaste, toothbrush, shampoo, deodorant, a small pack of tissues, a kind note with words of comfort/care, and a bag to place the items in.

Learning through play

Mind-Blown aims to prepare young people for an innovation-based economy by sparking curiosity in Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Maths. The game has attracted rave reviews from local innovators and education specialists who hail it as a breakthrough in boosting curiosity among learners.

Isobel Sobey, the educator who runs the Mind Blown club at the school said she noticed a visible excitement in her learners since they started playing

the game. They were exploring topics such as the solar system, animal kingdom, finding wow facts and other interesting bits of information.

"The learners look forward to Thursday afternoons – which is our club day. It's a fun afternoon with lots of facts and discussion. We have exceptional learners who think differently and the game strategy encourages learners to find unusual facts," Sobey said.

This year's tournament is expected to be bigger than ever. The huge interest in the tournament has prompted the organisers to establish a Berea league. Students urged to sign agreement to avoid NSFAS funding retraction

THE National Student Financial Aid Scheme (NSFAS) is calling on the 63 558 students who received funding and have not yet signed their loan agreement forms (LAFs) and schedules of particulars (SOP), to do so at their respective universities and TVET colleges as soon as possible, or before May 31, 2017. Affected students could possibly face retraction of NSFAS funding if they fail to honour their funding obligation, although they are approved for the 2017 funding.

NSFAS spokesperson, Kagisho Mamabolo said no loan advance will be made unless the Loan Agreement has been signed.

"It is our responsibility, as

stated in the National Credit Act 34 of 2005, that prior to entering into any credit agreement with a consumer, we must conduct a detailed financial assessment on behalf of the client. Now that we have done that, we are appealing to the students to do their part and sign the agreements for their own benefit. No credit agree-

ment can be concluded without

the signing of the agreement form and acceptance of the terms and conditions thereof," he said.

"We ensure that our students understand the risks, costs and obligations created by the financial assistance they are receiving. Signing of agreement is compulsory and common practice for any institution that provides financial assistance in

SA", added Mamabolo.

NSFAS will not process any tuition payments for students who have not signed their agreements. All funded students are obliged to acknowledge that they understand the terms and conditions and the amount of funding stipulated. Funded students who are eligible for financial assistance will continue to receive funding (automatically) until they complete their studies, provided they achieve the 50% pass mark.

To sign a LAF/ SOP, a student can visit the NSFAS website – *www.nsfas.org.za*, click on the SIGN YOUR LAF/SOP link, then enter an ID number into the search engine. Then details will appear on the screen.

THE first time I came across the word Crepuscule, was from the song Crepuscule With Nellie by the Thelonious Monk, which was recorded in 1957. At first I thought he made it up until I got an invite from the Playhouse Company about its new stages season, which included Crepuscule, a stage work based on the real-life story of Drum Magazine icon Can Themba.

The play is believed to be an interpretation of Themba's real life love affair with a white woman during the 1950s, a time when such relations were considered taboo. The play asks a range of pertinent and contemporary sociopolitical questions. Themba and Hart's illicit relationship across the apartheid 'colour bar' serves as a means to unpack just how much of our identity is formed by our environment and how much is shaped by our choices as individuals.

The Durban season has already sold out three performances. The cast includes Crepuscule stars Nat Ramabulana as Can Themba, with Kate Liquorish as his romantic partner. Tantner's work on the history house numbering might seem very academic, but it does highlight the importance placed on house numbering and the universality of the development of methods to identify houses and homesteads around the world, almost simultaneously, if not in a parallel manner of development.

It occurs for hundreds of years and even features in traditional myths and legends in the stories told in various cultures. Even today, as road names are changed, and suburbs grow and shrink with urban sprawl, gentrification, and development, the display of a number outside your home to show people which house is yours is something most people strive for, whether they live in a humble shack, or a mansion.

Even businesses use the numbering of their premises to reinforce their company brand, with some taking great pride in not only the number but also the name of the road in which their building is situated, proudly displaying it an elegant font on their road facing wall, gate, or signage.

As with other types of home decoration and adornment, the home numbering methods and fashions have changed over the years, from rudimentary numbering painted onto doors or walls, to the high tech digital signs and even glow in the dark signs that can be found today. If you follow a few basic rules you can have a house number which is both functional and decorative.

Don't paint them on the front of a post box but rather on the side of the box that faces oncoming traffic. Do make sure that you house numbers are not obscured by trees, overgrown shrubs or other objects such as parked cars by displaying them clearly on the house (at eye level or higher), on the post box and even the kerb, so if one number becomes obstructed the others will still be visible.



Don't try to be too fancy with a font style in which the numbers aren't clearly distinguishable or might be mistaken for other numbers. Also avoid Roman numerals which most people won't be able to decipher.

Do choose large numerals which are easy to hang, bold and wide enough to be noticed from a car driving towards your house on the street from either direction.

Tips to make your numbers stand out

Stencil them onto a wall in reflective paint or commission a graffiti artist to paint a mural which incorporates your address.

Numbers don't have to be horizontal. consider running them vertically, or in a stepped pattern, especially if your numbering at road level indicates the entrance to a home upstairs.

If your front door is close enough to the street, paint the number directly onto the door in a contrasting colour to the door.

'Imprint' the number of your address into concrete while it is still wet.

Don't hang numbers too close to a light source that might outshine or overshadow them or opt for brass or bronze numbers if you can help it as they tend to become 'invisible' no matter what kind of light shines on them due to them blending in with any background.



19-ford service



By Gavin Foster ate last year Honda launched their tenth-generation Civic, and as is the norm these days, it's a little bigger than the model it succeeds.

The Japanese manufacturer has sold 23 million Civics since 1972, and what started as a small affordable entry-level hatch has grown into a range of compact luxury cars that are good enough to compete against the premium German products in terms of quality.

The car sent to me for evaluation was the 1.5 Sport CVT sedan that, at R430,000 is the second-most dear of the four sedans on offer.

The two top models share a perky new 127kW/220Nm 1,498cc four-cylinder turbo engine, while the remaining two derivatives, the 1.8 Comfort and 1.8T Elegance, make do with Honda's naturally aspirated 1.8 litre VTEC four-cylinder motor that doles out a

more subdued 104kW and 174Nm. There is unfortunately but a single gearbox available in the Honda sedans - a CVT, or continuously-variable transmission. More on that later.

The Civic is much more aggressively styled than its predecessor, looking almost like a coupé, and I found it very appealing. There are lots of sharp edges and creases, and the Sport version has a fairly low front spoiler which didn't bother me, and a very business-like rear boot spoiler that did because it's out of place on this car.

The interior is tidily laid out and well screwed and glued using quality black leather with matte-silver and pianoblack trim. The digital display isn't irritatingly in-your-face, and there's plenty of interior space. That's a jolly good thing, because Honda's discontinued their Accord range in South Africa and obviously hopes that the Civic will help



fill the gap in their product line.

The Civic also comes with a full box of electronic communications, safety and comfort gubbins. This really sticks it to the German manufacturers who'd make their cars' tyre valve caps available only as expensive options if they thought they could get away with it.

The Civic would be a joy to drive, were it not for the CVT transmission,

but I must admit to a personal bias against these boxes because they are so akin to the droning transmissions found in 125cc scooters. The Honda's has seven artificial steps to make it mimic a conventional seven-speed auto, and it's very smooth, but the whole point of a CVT is that the engine stays in the torque band while the gearbox whines its way through an infinite number of ratios to keep it there.

Interestingly, I carted a good friend and ex-race driver, Mike Egan, who builds superb high performance cars and generally thinks anything with less than 300kW on tap needs to be cured with a V8 transplant, up to Camperdown. He surprised me by commenting on how classy the car was and particularly how smoothly the transmission shifted. "The kind of person who buys a car like this will probably love it," he said in response to my gripes. He has a

point, but I reckon more people would like and buy the car if it came with a six-speed manual or a conventional auto gearbox sans the built-in bulldust.

The Civic's 1.5-litre turbo engine is superb. The peak torque of 220Nm is on tap all the way from 1,750 to 5,500rpm and that's enough to get you up to 100km/h any time you have around eight seconds to spare.

Top speed is claimed to be 200km/h, which is largely academic on public roads these days, but the car's main attribute is just how good it feels on the road.

The ride is supple but firm, there's very little road or wind noise, the switchgear feels as well as looks solid, and everything feels very well put together. The only setback in my view is the transmission.

ord has introduced a number of exterior and interior features to its Focus range while also introducing a new diesel engine.

Derived from the ST and offered only on the midrange Trend hatchback, the optional (R19,984) styling pack consist of a model specific colour coded bodykit, tilt and sliding electric sunroof, boot spoiler, multispoke 17-inch alloy wheels, active bi-xenon headlights with daytime running LEDs, dual-zone climate control, heated and folding mirrors and rear privacy glass.

The Driver Assistance Pack (R17,089), which is available on four and fivedoor Trend models, not only features Advanced Active Park Assist, Lane Departure Warning, reverse camera and Lane Keep Assist, but also Ford's upgraded SYNC3 infotainment system with satellite navigation.

At the sharp end, rear parking sensors are now fitted as standard on both the ST1, ST3 and RS, with a reverse camera debuting on the ST3.

A 10-speaker sound system with subwoofer and SYNC3 can are options on the ST3 and RS.

Underneath the bonnet, the Focus retains its range of three and four-cylinder EcoBoost engines, with the biggest shake-up being the addition of a new 1.5 TDCi diesel engine in place of the long serving 1.6 TDCi.

Essentially the same unit recently launched in the revised Transit Connect, the new oil burner produces 88kW and 270Nm, and is linked exclusively to a sixspeed manual gearbox.

Volkswagen Amarok Now available with V6 power

ight from its launch in 2010, the Volkswagen Amarok became the most talked about bakkie in South Africa and one which managed to split the opinions

VW has sold 29,000 units locally these past seven years and recently gave the Amarok a mid-life facelift while also adding the long awaited 3.0-litre V6 TDI engine to the range.

In line with the old adage of "If it ain't broke, don't fix it", differentiating the Amarok from its pre-facelift sibling takes a keen eye with the Walter de'Silva-penned design now benefiting from a restyled front bumper with redesigned foglights, new grille and a LED third-brake light. Higher spec models also boast smoked taillight clusters, while wheel sizes range from 17 to 20 inches.


Volkswagen has revised the local model range with the Comfortline replacing the Trendline as the new entrylevel offering, followed by the Highline, the new Highline Plus and the Extreme in place of the previous Ultimate.

The biggest changes are inside with a completely new dashboard more akin to that of the latest Passat, with the previous audio system making way for a brand new 6.3-inch touchscreen in either Composition Media or Discover Pro guise.

Aside from including USB and Aux inputs, both systems also feature a new digital voice enhancement function, which amplifies the driver's voice through the hands-free microphone without requiring him to face passengers seated in the back.

With bakkie safety becoming more and more important, the Amarok has kept up with the times with a revised version of its Post Collision Warning and Electronic Stability Control, which are both standard across the range. Hill Decent Control and VW's trademark Off-Road ABS system are fitted to allwheel drive models too.

With the popularity of automatic transmissions in the leisure bakkie segment continuing to grow, self-shifters accounted for 81 percent of Amarok sales last year; VW has expanded availability of its eight-speed torque-converter auto to now include eight models, with the transmission also being the sole option on the 3.0 TDI. The brand has also discontinued all single cab Amarok versions.

The much debated fourcylinder engines in the lineup are unchanged with outputs of 103kW/340Nm and 132kW/420Nm respectively, but the new 3.0 TDI V6 now meets the demand for a bigger engine and essentially uses the same engine in various Audi and Porsche models, producing 165kW/550Nm with an overboost function adding 15kW and 30Nm for ten seconds.

These power outputs take the Amarok above the Ford Ranger

3.2 TDCI as the most powerful diesel bakkie on sale in South Africa.

Volkswagen claims the V6 Amarok will hit 100km/h from standstill in 8.0 seconds, before topping out at 193km/h while sipping diesel at a rate of 91/100km.

Having undertaken the first part of the local Amarok launch route from Bloemfontein to Clocolan in a BiTDI, stepping into the V6 felt no different until the loud pedal was mashed to the floor. Instant and accompanied by a pronounced turbo whistle, the surge of power was relentless and seemingly never ending as the speedo touched the national speed limit.

Most notable though was the complete lack of any engine or road noise from inside the cab, with another standout being the seamless manner in which the eight-speed 'box goes about its business. In spite of our specific V6 being fitted with paddle shifters, the 'box accomplished its task with such aplomb that is was left in Drive for most of the time.

Another eyebrow raiser with the launch of the automatic gearbox in 2014, was the lack of a low-range gearbox on all-wheel drive models in favour of a very low first gear. Presented with a challenging off-road course in the grounds of the Prynnsberg Estate, the Amarok made light work of the myriads of rocks, sand and water, only coming into contact with Mother Earth by virtue of its mud flaps.

While it has succeeded in upping the power stakes, the deciding factor in the success of the Volkswagen Amarok V6 TDI rests on whether buyers are prepared to stomach the lofty SUV price tag for its added grunt. Although sure to sell, it remains to be seen what effect it will have come the monthly sales figures.

BAIC enters South Africa with new D20

AVING announced an investment of R11billion last year to produce vehicles at the Coega **Industrial Development Zone** outside Port Elizabeth from 2018, Chinese state-owned automaker, Beijing Automobile International Corporation (BAIC), has launched its foray into the local market with the new D20 sedan and hatchback.

Marketed under the Senova name in China, the D20 draws similarities with the first generation Mercedes-Benz B-class externally, no doubt thanks to its partnership with the threepointed star, and, according to BAIC, rides on the same platform as the Smart ForFour.

Initially, the D20 range will consist of five models with a choice of two trim levels, two petrol engines and either a fivespeed manual or four-speed automatic gearbox.

Starting the line-up off, in hatchback only and Comfort trim you can choose between a 1.3-litre mill developing 75kW and 128Nm of torque, or a bigger 1.5 with 85kW and 148Nm. These models are only available with a manual gearbox. Standard equipment includes dual front airbags, rain sense wipers on the 1.5, auto-on headlights, electric windows, rear parking sensors, leather trimmed steering wheel and ABS with EBD.

The higher spec model comes with Fashion trim and offers a choice between hatch or sedan bodystyles, although the latter only comes fitted with the self-shifter as standard.

Building on the Comfort's equipment levels, the Fashion adds a six-speaker sound system, 6.5-inch touchscreen display with satellite navigation and USB, sunroof, climate control, heated and folding mirrors and daytime-running lights.

A-five year/120,000km warranty is standard on all models with a service plan optional.




